

SA OUTDOORS COLOURS SCHEME 2011

The colours scheme is to give archers a structured development to their ability to shoot over longer distances. I.e. demonstrate ability over one distance before attempting the next longer distance.

When an archer is attempting a distance that is well beyond their capability, a lot of time is wasted looking for arrows in the grass.

To earn a colour, the archer must achieve two scores as indicated on the score sheet. As a recognition of achieving the colour, the archer is presented with the appropriate colour cord. The previous cord must be handed back.

Note that there are separate cords for each bow type. They are distinguished as follows :-

Longbow	White end
Compound	Black end
Recurve	Red end
(Indoors	striped (yellow/green))

It is a requirement that an archer must have a cord for a shorter distance before attempting to shoot at the next longer distance.

All new archers must start at the shortest i.e. White cord.

The score sheet has room for two scores. When you have completed two scores on the sheet, then hand it to the records officer, EVEN IF neither score achieves the requirement. Because all scores contribute to your handicap and classification!

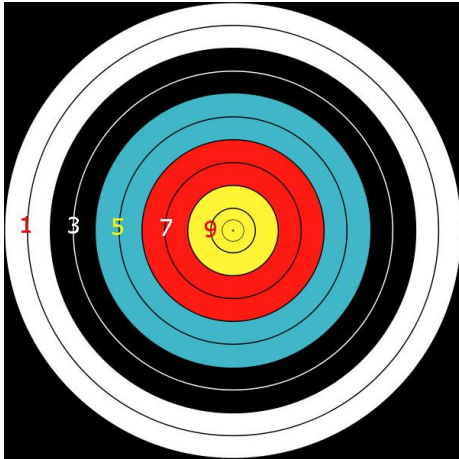
The Records Officer will be aware when you have the two required scores and will pass the details to the Cord Administrator.

The rounds are as follows

Cord	Round	Dist yds
		2doz each
White	Short Junior Warwick	30+20
Black	Junior Warwick	40+30
Blue	Short Warwick	50+40
Red	Warwick	60+50
Gold	Long Warwick	80+60
Purple	New Warwick	100+80

Each round consists of 4 dozen arrows (8 ends) - 2 dozen at each distance (4 ends)

The scoring is 5 zone
i.e. 9, 7, 5, 3, 1 working
outwards from the gold.

Frequently Asked Questions

[The White and Black rounds are 'Junior'. Are they for Juniors only?](#)

No, they are just the names of the rounds. New archers, Senior and Junior, must start with the White cord.

[What does 30+20 mean?](#)

Each of the rounds are shot over two distances and these are the two distances in yards e.g. 30 yds and 20 yds for the White cord.

[What if I fail to achieve the required score?](#)

All scores must be handed to the Records Officer as they all contribute to handicap and classification. He will note when you have achieved the two scores required for the cord and will alert the Cord Administrator.

[Do I have to use the prescribed score sheet?](#)

No, you can score on any sheet, iPad, iPhone, i... etc. and then submit your score via the website form.

[What do I do with the score sheet if the Records Officer is not available?](#)

You can hand it to any committee member or preferably submit your score via the website form.

[If I achieve my second cord score on the first entry on the score sheet, do I pass the score sheet to the Records Officer with only the one score?](#)
